At the Greater St. Louis Shetland Sheepdog Trial at Purina Carolyn Williams' Vegas turned in two more Q runs, one each in Standard and JWW at the Master level. Her efforts gave her a third and fourth place respectively.

In one day of trialing, Ann Behrens' Allie doubled Q'd and finished her Master Agility Bronze title. Lyric earned her first Excellent Standard Q and actually did the weaves in competition - twice! Allie was 5th in the Bad Dog Agility power rankings for Flat-coated Retrievers.

Mariorse Germick's Finnegan was 5th in the Bad Dog Agility Power Score Ranking for Collies at 20 inches preferred for the 1st quarter of 2024.

Carolyn Williams' Vegas had a good two days at the Standard Schnauzer Club of America National Specialty trial held at Purina Farms on August 21 and 22 where she is at Master level in all classes. Out of six runs she had 4 decent JOLT (Just One Little Thing) runs in FAST and Standard. Two of the six runs were Q's in JWW at the Master level.

It is called the [Title Application Portal \(TAP\)](#). The portal offers a fast and simple, step by step experience to apply for titles offered in Canine Good Citizen, Trick Dog, Temperament Test, Fit Dog, Fetch, Barn Hunt, Diving Dog, Disc Dog, Flyball, Virtual Home Manners, Search and Rescue and any one of the titles recognized under the Parent Club Title Recognition Program.

Users will need to login or create a MY AKC Account to begin.
